Are you a paediatric cancer survivor, aged 8 to 16 years?

Consider participating in our study!

What is the study about?

Some paediatric cancer survivors may experience cognitive difficulties. This study aims to compare different cognitive screening measures to help identify children/youth who need further assessment and resources.

Who can participate?

Paediatric cancer survivors aged eight to 16 years who are at least one year after the end of treatment, and English speaking. A parent will be invited to participate in the study, and a teacher may optionally be invited to participate.

What's involved?

- **Child/Youth:** One assessment (at SickKids) of cognitive skills and completing a questionnaire (duration: 2.5 hours)
- **Parent:** Five questionnaires to complete on child/youth's behavior, functioning, and quality of life, and one sociodemographic questionnaire (duration: one hour)
- **Teacher (optional):** Two questionnaires to complete on child/youth's learning and functioning (duration: 30 minutes)

Are there benefits to participating?

There are no direct benefits, but participation will contribute to identifying cognitive screening tools for pediatric cancer survivors to help improve their quality of life and daily functioning.

All participants will receive a gift card and a brief report of their performance in the study.
