Most of these scholarships will require a medical letter from your hospital confirming diagnosis. You can usually get this through your POGO AfterCare Clinic. Let your POGO Transitions Counsellor know if you need help to get this letter.

### **University and College Scholarships/Bursaries**

Schools offer entrance scholarships and bursaries to those with high grades, but they don't all depend on grades. Some scholarships are specific to a school or a field of study. Some are open to members of a specific group (e.g., service club or organization, high school, children of parents employed at a company).

Your high school guidance counsellor or the financial aid office at the school you plan to attend may be able to help you find scholarships. You can also search for scholarships at <u>www.studentawards.com</u> and <u>www.scholarshipscanada.com</u>.

#### **Student Loans/Grants**

Information and applications for government funding for post-secondary education are available from the <u>Ontario</u> <u>Student Assistance Program (OSAP)</u> (http://osap.gov.on.ca). Depending on your financial situation, you may qualify for loans and/or grants from the provincial and/or federal government. To get an idea of how much you could get, use the <u>OSAP aid estimator</u>. Even if you qualify for as little as \$1 in loans from OSAP, this opens the door to other scholarships and bursaries within the loan program (e.g. see Students with Disabilities below).

#### **Students with Disabilities**

When completing your OSAP application, indicate that you have a disability. You will need a physician or nurse practitioner to complete the OSAP disability forms. If you qualify for financial assistance through OSAP, you may also qualify for OSAP's Bursary for Students with Disabilities (BSWD) and Canada Student Grant for Services and Equipment for Persons with Permanent Disabilities. These programs may provide money for things like tutoring, equipment, etc. You can apply for the BSWD through your Accessibility Services Counsellor.
